Autumn's Story



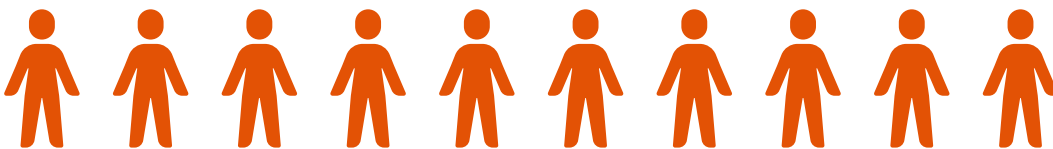
In the 2017-2018 school year, Autumn missed 31 days of school. MES connected her single father with their Family Coordinator who works with MES families to improve attendance and help parent's set and achieve personal goals. Overtime, her dad began setting and obtaining goals with the Family Coordinator around food security and transportation.

He started to raise egg laying & meat king chickens. After purchasing a freezer to store his meat, he added rabbits to his farm. He set goals around getting his drivers license reinstated, which was a process. He researched insurance and purchased a vehicle. Next, in installments, he bought a clamming license. One week, recently, her dad approached a police officer at the local convenience store to let him know that he was back on the road and that his car was completely legal. The officer hugged him and told him he was proud of him. In the fall of 2021, Autumn attended school 93% of the time.
