Growing up in a loving family and surrounded by good friends, no one knew that Sandra was in an abusive relationship.

"I did not recognize the abuse until it escalated, and I knew that I had to leave," she says.

Feeling scared and alone, Sandra didn't want to leave her home when she went to Second Stage Safe Haven, a United Way funded partner that provides housing and support to women and their children who have fled domestic violence.
