In 2012, Deanna was a single mother in an unhealthy relationship who's lack of confidence was stopping her from achieving her goals. One morning, she decided that she wanted to get her GED, and, in her research, found the Learning Exchange. She went to the Learning Exchange for a few months and took her GED exam — receiving her certification in the mail on the following New Years Eve.

Receiving her GED gave Deanna the confidence she needed to continue — so she decided to sign up for the PowerUp program at the Women's Empowerment Network. Through this program, she realized she was in an unhealthy relationship. Once she ended that relationship, she was able to make decisions and goals that reflected her wish to be the best mother she could possibly be. She set the goal of being accepted into college and was successfully enrolled in the Early Childhood Education program at NBCC!

- 16 women from First Steps are now enrolled in post-secondary education or employed and 100% of the 2016 graduates went on to post-secondary education.

We are so grateful for these partnerships and love being part of this community.

# Making a Difference





Two years ago, Rose went to the TRC with only the clothes on her back and with no place to call home. She had no money and was sleeping where she could. She was feeling extremely hopeless, but in the midst of all this, she was still attending school and maintaining good grades.

"I instantly fell in love with this young lady who had a spark and a spunk about her" said Alison, a caseworker at the TRC.

With the help of the caseworkers at the TRC, Rose got in contact with Social Development and was placed in the YES program. Once she had some money coming in, a few strings were pulled to have her put on the NB Housing list, and, with the help of Housing Alternatives, the TRC got her into a one bedroom, subsidized apartment.

Now that Rose has a sense of place, she has started a clothing room at her high school for those in similar situations, she continues to make high honours, and she will be attending UNBSJ in the Fall.


