I set mostly academic goals and got them. I still want to get my licence (I'm doing drivers ed now), become a tradesperson and eventually go to university. Now that the GED is done I can focus on these other steps. The GED was the foundation I needed to build everything off. The last 7 months has been life changing. Everyone in my class was so supportive, respectful and uplifting. It's been a time and a half! I met with Worklinks and got a full time job. My long term goal is Botany. I want to make sure I have two skilled trades that I can rely on. While I was here I took Money Matters and got my First Aid and WHMIS. I'm currently doing post secondary coaching. In my future I see myself living comfortably with a nice house, a dog and a white picket fence surrounded by plants and nature."

## **Great Outcomes**

### 82% of 133 targets were achieved or exceeded!

See examples of these outcomes below:

- → 92% of children in Blacks Harbour School's summer camp maintain/improved their reading over the summer
- → 113 new children were matched with a mentor through Big Brothers Big Sisters
- → 90% of children in Milltown Elementary's summer camp maintained or improved numeracy over the summer
- → 239 low income clients of received subsidized counselling at Family Plus
- → 72% of moms are living independently with their child, 3 years after leaving First Steps
- → 89% of children participating in Snider Mountain's New Horizons program experienced sustained improved Growth Mindset
- → 78% of Outflow clients set goals and have made progress toward greater stability
- → 86% of Saint John women from the Women's Empowerment Network Power Up program are now working or attending school

- → 92% of kids who regularly attend Boys & Girls Club programs post-secondary education plans
- → 21 women became attached to the workforce after attending the Enterprising Women program through the Community Loan Fund
- → 89 participants in the WorkLinks program at the Saint John Learning Exchange secured employment
- → 15 women at Second Stage left their abusive partner and are achieving the majority of their goals, and are accessing mental health or addiction supports.
- → 214 youth have built essential skills through orchestral training with Sistema
- → 57 individuals were helped to become more stable and independent through the Kings County Family Support Coordinator
- → 100% of grade 12 youth at the Teen Resource Centre have post secondary plans
- → 71% of women clients achieved sobriety at Sophia Recovery Centre.

Our rigorous funding model and accountability ensures that the funds entrusted to us by the community are invested in programs that make a measurable difference. 90% of our 2018/2019 Funded Partners met or exceeded their targets. We are thankful for their dedication and efforts in creating environments where real change can happen.

I was very pleased to take on the role of Interim Executive Director for United Way in the Fall. I am grateful to my predecessor, Wendy MacDermott for her mentorship and leadership in creating an organization that allows for true community collaboration. I also wish to thank the Board of Directors for entrusting me to continue leading our organization and region into the future. After 8 years of working in this space of community/social advocacy and seeing the results that happen when we come together as a united and collective movement, I am confident we can achieve the vision where everyone has "somebody to lean on".

### **Poverty**

- Education and training programs that lead to employment
- Coaching and goal setting moving individuals toward economic self-sufficiency
- Transportation to essential services and programs

#### **Mental Health**

- Subsidized counselling for individuals who would otherwise be unable to afford it
- Counselling for women who have fled domestic violence
- Support for women to reach and maintain recovery from addictions

#### **Domestic Violence**


- Housing and support for women and their children who have fled domestic violence

#### **Kids & Youth**


- Summer and afterschool programs to improve literacy and numeracy



# **Success Story**



Tracy joined Sistema at age 5 in 2014. While very enthusiastic, Tracy struggled with being still and quiet during class, becoming easily upset and having a hard time focusing. There would be days he'd hide under tables or run away from teachers. The next year, we worked with OT and learned how to help Tracy's restlessness. It still wasn't easy for him, but he didn't run away anymore. He eventually learned to manage frustration, reached our advanced orchestra, and took great pride in his progress!

In 2018 he successfully auditioned for the SJ Youth Orchestra and became a Sistema volunteer. Tracy's confidence and patience have grown and he's an excellent mentor. He can be trusted to watch a class of students, mentor one-on-one or in small groups and always be in the right place at the right time. Tracy is still only 11, but is able to take on the responsibilities of a high-school student. We are so proud of him and can't wait to see what the next 6 years will bring.
